History

Grace Grieve was born in Ingersoll, Ontario on September 15, 1914. Grace attended Victory Memorial Public School and Ingersoll Collegiate Institute, graduating in 1932. In 1939, Grace joined the staff of the then Tillsonburg High School where she taught Latin, English, History and in her earliest years Greek. She was a gifted and beloved teacher who spent much time creatively preparing lessons and working with students in the classroom and in extracurricular activities. Her lessons came alive with relevant stories from her life experiences and world travels. Because of her commitment and professionalism, she earned her high respect both in the school and wider community. After a dedicated career, she retired in June 1972. Grace's commitment to education and interest in young people continued throughout her life and prompted her to establish the Grace Grieve Scholarship with the Thames Valley Board of Education in the year before her death on July 10, 2008. She was 93.
