## Criteria

This award will be granted to a student with the following qualities:

- Consistently demonstrates personal integrity at school, within their family, and in the community
- Provides community service activities/volunteer work within the community
- Is recognized by peers and teachers as being a role model to others
- Is recognized by peers as being someone who puts others ahead of himself/herself
- Consistently demonstrates compassion, empathy and kindness to others
- Balances school, community service and family
- Is pursuing post-secondary education in a field that will enrich society by continuing to serve others (e.g., teaching, medical studies, theology, missionary work, etc.)
- Must maintain a 75% overall average in the last two years of high school
- Preference will be given to a student who has accepted to participate in a Volunteer Abroad program

## History

Established in 2011 by Andy Horner in memory of his wife. The scholarship was created to recognize a student in his or her final year of high school who demonstrates the highest level of service to their community and through such service enriches others' lives and serves as a role model for his or her peers.

## Selection Process

Candidates to be nominated by the individual school awards committee. Final selection to be made at the Oxford Awards Selection Committee meeting.
