School Within a College (SWAC) programs offer senior high school students the opportunity to take OSSD credit courses taught by secondary school teachers and Dual Credit courses taught by college professors/instructors within a collaborative learning community through face-to-face instruction.

The Woodstock SWAC program will be offering the following schedule which allows for an optional Dual Credit course to be taken by a student on Tuesday, as well as, all students will be participating in CO-OP.

Every SWAC student will be participating in CO-OP while in the Woodstock SWAC program. The CO-OP placement will be determined by the student based on a career interest and/or post-secondary pathway choice. Students will be provided training and certifications through Career Employment Services Oxford County to best prepare them for their work placement. This will allow the student to experience and achieve the necessary knowledge, work experience and certifications to make the informed choice of pursuing that job as a career.

All students that participate in the Woodstock SWAC program will also be participating in a Fanshawe College course which runs on Wednesdays. This is a collaborative approach to teaching by the college instructor delivering a first-year college course to the students and the SWAC teacher providing the high school elective credit (HSP3C) connected to the course through similar curriculum. If students are successful, they will achieve both a high school elective credit and a college credit.

Students can take an additional college course through the Dual Credit program on Tuesdays. This is optional for SWAC students but allows the SWAC student to achieve an additional high school elective credit if successful. Please refer to the Fall 2026 Dual Credit program information package for course options and descriptions.

Finally, students can further individualize the Woodstock SWAC program on Fridays. This day is set for a student to take a self-study OSSD course, accumulate more CO-OP hours or work remotely from home. Students are still welcome and encouraged to access the campus and/or conference with their SWAC teacher for additional support.

Students being referred for the SWAC program should:

- Be entering their Grade 12 or 12+ year of high school,
- Understand priority will be given to applicants requiring 8-10 credits or less for graduation but students needing 10+ credits should apply,
- Have the academic ability to be successful in college level courses and will be working towards completing ENG4C and,
- Understand transportation for students residing outside of the Woodstock city boundaries will be contingent on consortium busing.

SWAC Referral Process:

- Students that are enrolled at a secondary school can be referred through the SWAC/Dual Credit online registration system. A SWAC Request form needs to be completed and signed by the home school administration.
- Students that are off roll and not in a high school can contact David Carnevale at (519) 639-6212 and/or D.Carnevale@tvdsb.ca for information regarding application and interview process.

SWAC Interview Process:

- SWAC Coordinator will contact the referred student to discuss the SWAC program and answer any questions the student may have.
- If the candidate is still interested in attending the program, the corresponding SWAC teacher will arrange an interview with the student, either at their home school or at Fanshawe.
- Interviews will start to be scheduled during the first week of June (or earlier) and will occur throughout that month.

SWAC Confirmation Process:

- Home schools will be notified of successful and unsuccessful candidates by the SWAC teacher no later than **Wednesday, June 24**.
- Students who are interviewed will be notified of their acceptance via email/phone by their interviewing SWAC teacher.
